Saxon Shore Early MusicKenardington continues its three-times postponed series celebrating the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Ludwig van Beethoven, with an intriguing concert by the Consone Quartet, who are the only period string quartet to be accepted onto the BBC New Generation scheme as well as a chamber music fellowship at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama.

Their programme entitled *Sick Genius Reveries* explores the strained relationship between Beethoven and George Onslow, only the second Honorary Fellow of the *Philharmonic Society of London* (after Mendelssohn), who wrote some seventy-one works alone for string quartet or quintet combination. He was famously quoted as saying "*The last quartets of Beethoven are mistakes, absurdities, the reveries of a sick genius.... I would burn everything I have composed if I someday wrote anything resembling such chaos*". Beethoven's Opus 135 was the last major work he completed a few months before his death. Beethoven wrote, "*Here, my dear friend, is my last quartet. It will be the last; and indeed, it has given me much trouble.*"

This concert will be given with social distancing measures, repeated at two performances.
