810 Village Matters QE2 Play Area We are still awaiting details from Ashford BC regarding the lease, which is currently with their Legal Department Community Speedwatch The Clerk made enquiries regarding a Speed Indicator Device ALL (SID), these are battery operated and can be moved as required. The signs can be mounted on road signs, tripods or on trollies and range from simple signs just indicating speed to signs with messages on for drivers. Kits are available from KCC Highways which include a mini-SID and 3 poles installed is approximately £6,800 plus VAT, but more cost-effective systems are available. Unipar; the suppliers of the Speedwatch equipment; offer a range of kits which include the display, stand, power pack & ALL charger and a hard carry case for easy storage and transportation. The cost of this package is currently £1687 + VAT and delivery. This option can be upgraded to a 'smiley face' type display. This kit has the same components as the standard dual message with a slight increase in price to £1985 + VAT and delivery. Both models come with a one-year warranty on parts and labour. Highways Improvement Plan (HIP) ALL HIPs are run in conjunction with Kent Highways to indicate desired, long term, projects to improve roads and footpaths in the village, rather than general maintenance, and these are updated annually. Kieran Doble, Community Engagement Officer at KCC Highways will assist us with the initial plan and advise us on available funding. Suggestions received are the purchase of a SID, improvement to High House junction and closure of the unofficial laybys on both Appledore and Woodchurch Roads, 811 Village Hall Refurbishment Cllr Hedley updated Councillors on the current situation, BH explaining that completion of the main hall, including the cladding, heating and decoration will take priority over the toilet area. This will allow the hall to be actively promoted and increase bookings.

812	Green Energy - Cllr McIntyre explained that UK Power Network intend to fit a new transformer in the village next year as the area has been identified as one where usage will increase due to the uptake in electric vehicles. Councillors agreed to keep the item on the agenda.
